The Week in Review

- For reading and language, we completed our "Neighborhood" unit. We continued learning about people/places in our neighborhood. Our "Interactive Read-Aloud" was an African legend called "Why the Moon is in the Sky". In this story, Anansi the spider has 6 sons whose names reflect their special abilities (i.e. "Sees Trouble" and "Stone Thrower"). Each child then wrote in their journal about what their special name would be ask them what they chose! We reviewed the high frequency words "are", "for" and "you".
- For math this week, we discussed the addition symbol (+ sign). We modeled number stories using counters and the addition symbol. We introduced 3-dimensional shapes this week: cone, cube, cylinder, sphere, rectangular prism. The children practiced naming, describing and comparing these objects. We also reviewed the numbers 0-20 and practiced the concepts of greater/more than and less than.
- As we mentioned before, the children are now using lined paper for their journal work.
 Overall, they have adjusted quite well. We are also emphasizing proper sentence structure - beginning each sentence with an uppercase letter, leaving spaces between words and ending with punctuation.
- Our "Let's Find Out" for this week taught us about George Washington. We discussed that he was the 1st President of the United States and we talked about ways that his life was different than ours today.
